ASPEN SANTA FE BALLET ANNOUNCES ITS 2017 SUMMER PERFORMANCE SERIES IN SANTA FE, NM

Exclusive One-Night-Only by Compagnie Hervé Koubi • *World Premiere by Brazilian Choreographer Fernando Melo*

This summer, audiences in Santa Fe will be swept away by a one-night-only performance of *What the Day Owes to the Night (Ce Que le Jour Doit à la Nuit)* by **Compagnie Hervé Koubi** (**July 23**). Choreographed by the French-Algerian Hervé Koubi and performed by 12 men hailing from Algeria and Burkina Faso, this hour-long work fuses elements of hip-hop, acrobatics, street and modern dance. In a similar melding of influences, the score blends traditional Sufi music alongside J.S. Bach and Hamza El Din & the Kronos Quartet to create an emotionally intense, almost ritualistic performance.

After making a splash in the winter of 2016 with *Re:play*—his critically-acclaimed **Aspen Santa Fe Ballet** choreographic debut—**Brazilian choreographer Fernando Melo** returns to ASFB this summer to create a second ballet, as yet untitled. Now a resident of Sweden, Melo is an indemand choreographer for dance and opera companies across the European continent. While the theme of his works varies, Melo remains interested in "the production and communication of meaning through a performance." He explains: "In every piece I create, I attempt to convey significance and to appeal and connect with human emotions."

ASFB will also perform *Eudaemonia* by Los Angeles-based choreographer Cherice Barton, which recently premiered in February 2017. *Eudaemonia* is a co-commission with the Valley Performing Arts Center (VPAC) in Northridge, CA, where ASFB is the dance company-in-residence for two more years. Of Barton's work, VPAC Executive Director Thor Steingraber says: "There is something uniquely Hollywood about Cherice's aesthetic and her approach to dance and performance." The third ballet to be performed is TBD. Aspen Santa Fe Ballet will perform this program twice in Santa Fe (**July 15 & Sept. 2**).

Tickets for all summer series performances go on sale to the public in late May. Aspen Santa Fe Ballet's bold vision – top global choreographers, distinctive groundbreaking works, and virtuoso dancers – has fostered a jewel of a dance company in the American West and beyond. ASFB's unique pioneering spirit arises from a paired set of home cities: Aspen, nestled high in the Rocky Mountains, and Santa Fe, gracing the majestic Southwestern plateau.

Since its founding in 1996 by Bebe Schweppe, the company has served as a prestigious incubator and a showcase for choreographic invention to popular and critical acclaim. The performing troupe forms the core of a multifaceted arts organization with activities in both Aspen and Santa Fe. Repeat engagements at the Joyce Theater, Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, Kennedy Center, Wolf Trap Center for the Performing Arts, the American Dance Festival and the Harris Theater for Music and Dance have built a national reputation. The company has also toured internationally to Brazil, Canada, France, Greece, Guatemala, Israel and Italy. A respected arts presenter, ASFB curates high-quality dance programming for home audiences. Dance education is a priority, with well-established ballet schools training children and adults in both markets. An outreach program steeped in Mexico's rich folkloric culture fortifies community connections. Premier funders such as the National Endowment of the Arts, the Joyce Foundation, the Wolf Trap Foundation, Dance St. Louis and The Princess Grace Foundation have supported ASFB's growth. In 2010 the Joyce Theater Foundation conferred upon Artistic Director Tom Mossbrucker and Executive Director Jean-Philippe Malaty the Joyce Theater Award in honor of their pioneering and innovative model for American dance.
